INNOVATION ACADEMY

The Innovation Academy (IA) continues UF's legacy of ingenuity. Collaboration is at the heart of this unprecedented learning community. IA brings together students from more than 30 majors, leading to a convergence of original ideas centered on innovation, creativity, entrepreneurship, ethics and leadership.

IA students take courses in the spring and summer. In the fall, they can pursue study abroad programs, internships and other opportunities. innovationacademy.ufl.edu

PACE: COMBINING ONLINE AND RESIDENTIAL LEARNING

Pathway to Campus Enrollment, or PaCE, provides freshmen with the opportunity to start their UF degree online and then transition to campus in order to complete an undergraduate degree. Applicants are considered for PaCE through the regular freshman application. Only students who select a PaCE major on their UF application will be considered for PaCE.

With 60 majors in seven colleges, PaCE features our esteemed faculty and meets the same rigorous UF academic standards that students encounter on campus.

Students admitted to PaCE will complete a minimum of 15 credit hours and two semesters through UF Online. After completing a total of 60 credit hours and all prerequisite courses, students may request to transition to campus.

THE MACHEN FLORIDA OPPORTUNITY SCHOLARS PROGRAM supports low-income undergraduate students who are the first in their family to attend college. The University of Florida is committed to financially supporting academically talented students who might not otherwise attend UF because of financial barriers.

THE UF PROMISE PROGRAM consists of freshmen whom UF believes will benefit from additional support to enrich their academic success. Students are selected by the Office of Admissions.

UF OPEN HOUSE is an annual event held in the summer that allows rising high school seniors to visit campus and learn more about life at UF. Students will have the opportunity to learn about the admissions process, financial aid opportunities and campus life.

FLORIDA DAYS are held annually in the spring to allow admitted students to learn more about UF before they make their decision. Students have the opportunity to visit campus and learn about student life, academics and much more.

DESTINATION UF events are held in the spring in various cities to allow admitted students who can't make it to campus to learn more about UF before making their decision. Events are held in South Florida, the Florida panhandle, Atlanta, Texas, California, New York, Pennsylvania and Virginia.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

UF recalculates high school grade point averages based on academic courses. College-level courses such as dual enrollment, AP, IB or AICE get an extra 1.0 weight, meaning an A will be calculated as a 5.0 credit. Honors-level courses such as Honors, Pre-IB and Pre-AICE will get an extra .5 weight, meaning an A will be calculated as a 4.5 credit.

SIXTEEN ACADEMIC UNITS, DISTRIBUTED AS FOLLOWS:

- 4 English (with substantial writing)
- 4 Mathematics (Algebra 1, Formal Geometry, Algebra 2)
- 3 Natural Sciences (two units must include laboratory)
- 3 Social Sciences
- 2 Foreign Language (must be sequential)



UF has two recreation centers for student use, including a 140,000-square-foot Southwest Rec Center.



UF FRESHMAN APPLICATION AND DEADLINES

The University of Florida accepts the Coalition Application and the Common Application. The UF supplement will be available in August. The priority deadline for applications is **November 1**. Applications received after November 1 will receive a decision on a space-available basis only.

- OCTOBER 1**
Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) available.
- NOVEMBER 1**
Deadline for submission of the Coalition or the Common Application and UF Supplement. Pay the \$30 nonrefundable application fee and \$5 processing fee or indicate fee waiver. Application fee is waived for students who qualify for SAT and ACT waiver.
- DECEMBER 1**
Submit and link the Student Self-Reported Academic Record by **December 1**.
- DECEMBER 15**
Test score submission deadline. Students should arrange to have official ACT and/or SAT scores sent directly to UF from the testing service by **December 15**. Submit FAFSA before on-time deadline of **December 15**.
- LATE FEB**
Admission decision notification for priority applications.
- MAY 1**
\$200 tuition deposit due to confirm UF enrollment.
- JULY 15**
Last day for applicants to send UF their final high school transcripts.

FINANCIAL AID

Encourage your students to apply early for financial aid! Students must be accepted for enrollment at UF before they are considered for financial aid, but they should apply for aid before being admitted. The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) can be filed as early as October 1 at www.fafsa.gov. UF's "On-Time" deadline to receive the results of the FAFSA from our data processor is December 15. Students should apply well before December 15 to ensure that the federal processor has time to analyze and send the results of the FAFSA to the Office for Student Financial Affairs. Financial aid is awarded on a first-come, first-served basis so students must apply as early as possible to be considered for the most and best aid. The University of Florida also participates in the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program, which is funded by the State of Florida, and the Florida Prepaid College Plan. Refer to the Office for Student Financial Affairs website for information: sfa.ufl.edu/prospective

THE STUDENT SELF-REPORTED ACADEMIC RECORD (SSAR)

The SSAR is a student self-reported academic record that lists the classes and associated grades that have been attempted, or will be attempted, for high school and/or college credit. It replaces the high school and college transcripts used by the Office of Admissions during the initial review process. Since accuracy is critical, students are advised to have a copy of their high school transcript available to use as a reference when creating the SSAR.

MANY WAYS TO BECOME A FLORIDA GATOR

- 1 Traditional, residential campus student.
- 2 Innovation Academy, operating on a spring-summer enrollment schedule with more than 30 majors.
- 3 PaCE, offering at least 60 majors. Students complete at least 15 hours via UF Online and transfer to the residential campus after earning 60 credit hours. Only students who select a PaCE major will be considered for PaCE.
- 4 UF Online, offering 100 percent online learning with more than 30 majors.

HOW TO APPLY AS AN INTERNATIONAL STUDENT

- 1 Complete the Coalition Application or Common Application and UF supplement by **November 1**.
- 2 Submit the \$30 nonrefundable application fee and \$5 processing fee in U.S. funds.
- 3 Submit official high school transcript in native language and English translation (if applicable). All transcripts from non-U.S. based high schools must be submitted to a credential evaluation agency.
- 4 Submit official SAT and/or ACT test scores and English proficiency scores.



Pathways to Admission

- Freshman Honors Program Application: Completed as part of the UF Admissions application
- University Honors Program Application: Students who earn a 3.5 UF GPA and complete 28+ credits during their freshman year will be invited to apply during the following summer



Freshman Honors Program (FHP) Application Timeline

- Honors Application Available: August (same as UF Admissions)
- Honors Application Deadline: November 1 (same as UF Admissions)
- Honors Acceptance Notification: Late February (same as UF Admissions)
- Honors Participation Confirmation Deadline: May 1, 11:59pm ET (separate from UF Admissions)



Factors Considered in FHP Admissions Decisions

- Two Honors-Specific Essays - Most Important
- High School Record, UF Admissions Application - Very Important
- Class Rank, Alumni Relations, Recommendations - Not Considered
- Note: Students admitted to UF Online, PaCE, or as transfers will be not considered



Freshman Honors Program Completion Requirements

- 3.5+ GPA during their first year at UF
- 2+ credits of Honors courses, completed with a B or higher
- No Student Conduct Code (probation or higher) / Honor Code (responsible) violation
- Successful completion automatically places a student into the University Honors Program



University Honors Program Completion Requirements

- Earn 8 Academic Points - e.g. Honors Courses, Research, Double Major, Minor, Honors Thesis
- Earn 6 Enrichment Points - e.g. Study Abroad, Internship, Leadership, Service, Performing Arts
- Graduate with Honors in the Major at the *cum laude* level

High school students who want to apply for a 4 year Army ROTC scholarship go to:

On this website, you can start the application process. You will need to upload your high school transcript that covers through the end of your junior year as well as your SAT or ACT score. The score must be validated in the Cadet Command Information Management System (CCIMS). At this point, you are Professor of Military Science (PMS) interview ready but it is recommended that you take your fitness test first, then set an appointment with the closest PMS for the interview. After the interview, all info is uploaded into CCIMS and your complete application is board ready. Boards take place in October, January, and March.

 - Transcript uploaded
 - SAT or ACT score uploaded
 - Fitness test complete
 - PMS Interview complete
- } Interview ready
- } Board ready

Note: The fitness test can be taken with a JROTC instructor. If the school does not have a JROTC, any sports athletic coach can administer the fitness test. You can download the scorecard off the website.
