THINKING ABOUT TRANSFERRING TO UF?

To be eligible to transfer to UF, you need to complete an Associate of Arts degree from a Florida public institution or **at least 60 transferable semester credit hours** from any regionally accredited institution. If you have less than 60 semester credit hours or have already completed a bachelor's degree, you are not eligible to transfer to an on-campus program. In this case, you should consider applying to a UF Online program or to one of UF's graduate, professional or post-baccalaureate programs. Transfer Admissions Eligibility

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Can show competency in a foreign language. You can do this by providing a high school transcript showing that you completed two years of the same foreign language OR by completing 8-10 semester hours of the same foreign language. If you have fluency in a language other than English, contact us for more information. admissions.ufl.edu/contacts
- Have a minimum 2.0 overall GPA and a minimum 2.0 GPA from your last-attended institution, as calculated by UF.
- Have completed or will complete specific requirements for your intended major before attending UF. Refer to your intended UF college's website or contact them directly to be sure that you meet all of their requirements: admissions.ufl.edu/college-contacts

TRANSFER PROCESS

- Refer to admissions.ufl.edu/apply/transfer for information about how to apply.
- Apply by your intended college's deadline. Contact them directly or refer to these posted deadlines: admissions.ufl.edu/apply/transfer/dates-and-deadlines.
- After submitting your application, send in a transcript from each institution attended regardless of length of attendance or credit earned. Admissions also needs your high school transcript if you fulfilled the foreign language requirement in high school.
- Check your status! This is the best way to stay updated on your application: admissions.ufl.edu/appstatus. Your UF admissions decision will be posted here, too.



TRANSFER FAQ

- **How do I know if my courses will transfer?**
Refer to admissions.ufl.edu/apply/transfer/credit-evaluation for more information.
- **How many credits hours do I need to have if my school is on the quarter system?**
90 quarter hours equates to 60 semester hours.
- **Can I take my prerequisite courses at UF?**
No, all prerequisite courses must be taken prior to attending the University of Florida.
- **Can I apply before I have completed all requirements?**
Yes, as long as you indicate on your application that you will meet all requirements before the term to which you are applying.
- **Can I transfer to UF without declaring a major?**
No, all transfer students must declare a major on the application.
- **Is it possible to double major as a transfer student?**
Yes, you would select your preferred major on your application and then work with the college to which you are applying to determine if a second major can be accomplished.
- **Can I apply for two majors simultaneously?**
No, transfer students may only be considered for one major.
- **If I am admitted into a major and then decide that I don't like it, can I switch majors?**
It is highly unlikely that you will be able to change your major after being admitted.
- **What is the deadline to apply?**
It varies by college and major. You can find application deadlines here: admissions.ufl.edu/apply/transfer/dates-and-deadlines. You can apply up to one year in advance.
- **What if I need to make changes to my application?**
If you have submitted your application and need to make a change, email transfer@admissions.ufl.edu.
- **Do I need to send in my AP/IB/AICE/CLEP scores?**
Yes, you need to send them in separately, unless you are earning your AA degree from a Florida public institution.
- **Do I need send in my SAT or ACT scores?**
You do not need to send in SAT or ACT scores unless you are applying to an education or building construction major.

- **Where should my transcripts be mailed?**

- **When will I get my decision?**
It varies. The admissions office reviews your application for completeness, but the actual admissions decision is made by the college/department to which you are applying.
- **I already have a bachelor's degree and would like to get another. Can I get my second bachelor's degree at UF?**
UF does not allow students to earn a second bachelor's degree on campus. This option is only available through UF Online: ufonline.ufl.edu.
- **Is it easier to transfer from Santa Fe College?**
Students earning an AA degree from any Florida public institution have equal preference in the admission process.
- **I am a senior in high school and will have my AA degree or 60 college credits when I graduate high school. Should I apply as a transfer?**
No, all high school students who will graduate with an AA degree or 60 college credits should apply as freshmen and select an intended major. If you are not able to be admitted as a freshman, you may wish to apply as a transfer. Your consideration will be based on if you have met the prerequisites for the major.
